REsources for the REsistance

"Love is the Doctrine of This Church..."

You are finishing it in your head even as we speak, aren't you? The weekly repetition over the years, or even the months or weeks, has settled it into your bones. Next time we are saying our Unison Affirmation together in worship, watch the children, even some of the littlest ones who've been coming for awhile. A few weeks ago, I watched some children who were maybe on their third or fourth visit, already reciting the affirmation without looking at the Order of Service.

Love is the doctrine of this church,
The quest for truth is its sacrament,,
And service is its prayer.
To dwell together in peace,
To seek knowledge in freedom,
To serve human need,
To the end that all souls shall grown into harmony with the sacred,
Thus do we covenant with each other.

Repetition is vital to learning, and ritual is vital to a child's spiritual development. This fall, as we turn our focus to our Unitarian Universalist Identity, the children and youth will be taking apart the Unison Affirmation to dig into the meaning behind the words they say every week. If Love is our doctrine, what does teaching that doctrine look like? What is a sacrament, and why would we compare that to our free and responsible search for truth and meaning? If service is our prayer, is prayer also our prayer? How and whom do we serve? Does service ever look different from what we might imagine?

What does it mean to "dwell together in peace?" Does it mean that we never experience conflict or disagreement, or does it mean that we find ways to resolve our conflicts that do not end in harm or violence in action or language? And if we can do that within our walls, how do we then carry that out into the world? In what ways do we serve human need, and what does it mean to a Unitarian Universalist to "grow into harmony with the sacred?" What, indeed, is "the sacred?" These words of our covenant are not rules, for rules come from some top-down authority, and are often nonnegotiable. Like all the covenants we make, in our small groups, our classes, and our congregation, these words we say each week are sacred promises we make to each other about the way we will be together. We should say them not as a rote recitation, but as more of a meditation, with open hearts and an awareness of the connections we are making with the people around us.

The affirmation is credited to an early 20th Century Universalist minister, the Rev. L. Griswold Williams, who included it in his 1933 collection of readings for worship. However, various versions of the affirmation are said to have been in use in congregations prior to that publication, so its original authorship is possibly uncertain. Want to be part of this great learning experience? One of the best ways to learn is to TEACH, and we are still in need of more teachers for this pillar. Regular classes start on SEPTEMBER 8!
